Vizag (Visakhapatnam), Andhra Pradesh

A coastal jewel of the Eastern Ghats, Vizag seamlessly blends natural splendour with urban charm. Its pristine beaches, like Rishikonda and Yarada, are perfect for serene sunrises and relaxing walks. Ramakrishna Beach, another must-visit spot, is a lively stretch where you can enjoy local snacks and watch fishermen at work. History buffs can dive into India's naval legacy at the Submarine Museum, the first of its kind in South Asia, or visit the INS Kursura submarine. For panoramic views of the Bay of Bengal, take a cable car ride to Kailasagiri Hill Park, where lush gardens and statues add to the charm. Don't miss the nearby Araku Valley, a tranquil hill station surrounded by coffee plantations and waterfalls. History enthusiasts will also love exploring the ancient Buddhist sites of Thotlakonda and Bavikonda, which exude a timeless spiritual charm.

Ziro Valley, Arunachal Pradesh

Cradled in the Eastern Himalayas, Ziro Valley is a paradise for nature and culture enthusiasts. Known for its emerald-green paddy fields dotted with bamboo platforms, it's the homeland of the Apatani tribe, whose unique customs and sustainable farming practices are a fascinating study. The tribe is also known for its distinctive facial tattoos and traditional nose plugs. Trek through verdant forests and rolling hills, or enjoy the melodious sounds of local folk music. Time your visit with the Ziro Music Festival, where global artists perform against the backdrop of lush landscapes. Adventure seekers can explore the nearby Talley Valley Wildlife Sanctuary, home to rare species of flora and fauna. The blend of cultural richness and natural beauty makes Ziro Valley an unmissable destination.

Tawang, Arunachal Pradesh

High up in the misty mountains, Tawang is synonymous with spirituality, serenity, and scenic grandeur. Visit the iconic Tawang Monastery, the largest in India, to witness its stunning architecture and spiritual ambience. The monastery is a treasure trove of Buddhist scriptures, vibrant murals, and ancient relics. For adventure seekers, the trek to Sela Pass offers breathtaking views of snow-covered peaks and crystal-clear lakes, such as Paradise Lake. The Bum La Pass, steeped in historical significance as the Indo-China border, offers a sobering yet awe-inspiring experience. Another must-see is the Nuranang Waterfall, a cascading wonder tucked amidst dense greenery. The Jaswant Garh War Memorial, honouring soldiers of the 1962 Sino-Indian War, completes your journey through this enchanting mountain town.

Mawlynnong, Meghalaya

Dubbed the “Cleanest Village in Asia,” Mawlynnong is a model of sustainable living. Its spotless streets, blooming gardens, and eco-friendly bamboo structures create a utopian charm. The Skywalk, crafted by locals, offers stunning vistas of the Bangladeshi plains. The living root bridges—natural wonders formed by centuries-old intertwined roots—showcase an extraordinary symbiosis between humans and nature. Mawlynnong’s warm hospitality and dedication to eco-conscious practices make it both a visual and emotional delight. Nearby attractions include the Dawki River, with its crystal-clear waters, perfect for boating and swimming.

Meghamalai, Tamil Nadu

Known as the “High Wavy Mountains,” Meghamalai in the Western Ghats is a sanctuary of peace and verdant beauty. Its sprawling tea estates, cool climate, and mist-shrouded hills make it an idyllic retreat. Explore the cascading Vattaparai Falls or venture into the Meghamalai Wildlife Sanctuary, home to rare species like the lion-tailed macaque and great Indian hornbill. For those seeking solitude, the hill station’s tranquil lakes and mist-covered forests provide the perfect setting for quiet introspection. This untouched haven offers the perfect respite from the chaos of city life.

Chopta, Uttarakhand

Often referred to as the “Mini Switzerland of India,” Chopta is a pristine hill station untouched by commercialization. It serves as the base for treks to Tungnath Temple, the world’s highest Shiva temple, and Chandrashila Peak, which offers sweeping views of the Himalayan range. In spring, the forests come alive with blooming rhododendrons, painting the landscape in vivid hues. Camping under the stars in Chopta’s lush meadows is an unforgettable experience. Nearby attractions include Deoria Tal, a high-altitude lake reflecting the snow-capped peaks in its crystal-clear waters.

Aizawl, Mizoram

The vibrant capital of Mizoram, Aizawl, offers a harmonious blend of tradition and modernity. Perched on hilltops, the city provides panoramic views of lush valleys. Visit the grand Solomon's Temple for spiritual solace or trek to Durtlang Hills for breathtaking vistas. The bustling Bara Bazar is the perfect spot to shop for traditional handlooms and savour local delicacies. A visit to the Reiek Heritage Village offers a glimpse into Mizo culture, with traditional huts, folk performances, and scenic surroundings. With its laid-back vibe and friendly locals, Aizawl is a hidden gem waiting to be discovered.



Champhai, Mizoram

Close to the Indo–Myanmar border, Champhai is a picturesque destination known as the “Rice Bowl of Mizoram.” Its vast green fields framed by rolling hills create a dreamlike landscape. The Murlen National Park boasts dense forests and rare wildlife, while the heart-shaped Rih Dil Lake holds deep cultural and spiritual significance for the Mizo people. Another highlight is Lengteng Wildlife Sanctuary, home to rare and endangered species. Champhai’s tranquil ambience makes it an ideal getaway for those seeking introspection.

Kaas Plateau, Maharashtra
